REPORT FROM THE RSS AD HOC COMMITTEE ON ETHICS

At the 2016 Annual Meeting, the RSS Council recommended (and the membership supported at the RSS Business Meeting) that an ad hoc committee on ethics be established to develop a draft proposal for a "Code of Ethics" for the society, and to circulate that proposal to the broader RSS membership for feedback. This ad hoc committee met several times over the last few months and presented a draft Code of Ethics and Policies and Procedures document to the RSS Council for feedback at their November 14, 2016 meeting. At that time, the RSS Council made a few edits and voted to distribute this draft to membership for feedback. Read full report here.

RSS NOMINATIONS ANNOUNCEMENT

The Rural Sociological Society (RSS) is currently seeking nominations for leadership positions. Positions are open to all RSS members and self-nominations are encouraged.

The Nominations Committee seeks nominations that represent the diverse interests and background of RSS membership, including, but not limited to: race and ethnicity, geography, gender and sexuality, institutional affiliations (e.g. non-land grant and non-academic), age, physical abilities, education, and nationality as well as representation of the spectrum of research, teaching, extension, public service, and administrative interests of the membership.

Nominations are sought for the following positions:

1. <u>President-elect</u>: serves for three years as President-elect, President and Past President (voting member of Council each year)

2. <u>Vice President:</u> serves for one year (voting member of Council for that year)
